

We come from two countries and many places. If you added up the number of times each of us has moved, you truly wouldn't believe the number! Now, we are so grateful and so glad to be together, in one place, a family of five.

If you asked us what makes us a family, we might say our shared love of our three rapscallion pups & one very unappreciated independent cat. We might say our love of long walks, family meetings full of games, singing, dancing and improv, taco nights and ice cream - we steadfastly love ice cream!

We'd say one or most of us are hams, two or few of us are superb athletes, and three or more can really dance. Most of us like playing games and telling stories and two or three of us are deep listeners. We all absolutely love each other, social justice, lending a hand, and adventuring near and far.

If you are looking for us, we are likely by some water, in the woods or at the beach, seeing or making art, fixing or building something, or finding a way to support anti- racism and queer families full of love.



We believe in actions that are loving, saying we're sorry (adults and kids), understanding and healing trauma, supporting birth family connections and celebrating the race and ethnic stories of all of us. We like church (some of us more than others) and some of us like holidays very much. We celebrate PRIDE year around. Mostly, we like the times we are together being ourselves talking, laughing eating, and holding each other up.

If you are thinking of growing a family through adoption, we say "DO IT!" and if you want to talk to any of us about adoption, we'd love to talk to you.

Are you ready to learn more?

The children featured in the Heart Gallery are just some of the hundreds of children in foster care in Rhode Island right now waiting to be adopted—waiting for someone like you. There are children of all ages, coming from a variety of ethnic and religious backgrounds—each an individual with likes and dislikes, interests and talents, hopes and dreams. They are resilient and courageous and share a need and longing for love, guidance, security and the sense of belonging.

Who can adopt?

In RI you may adopt a child if you are over 21 years of age—there is no upper age limit. We believe that there is a family for every child and understand that families come in many different forms. Single people and couples of any sexual orientation or gender identity are welcomed as adoptive parents.

What is the cost to adopt? What kind of income does an adoptive parent need?

There is no fee to adopt a child in state care. The Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) is a public agency and offers its adoption services free of charge. Furthermore, some children in DCYF care are eligible to receive subsidies until they are 18 or 21, depending on their needs. There are no income requirements for adoptive families and no requirement for adoptive parents to be homeowners.

How do I begin?

We suggest coming to an Information Meeting. These meetings are held once a month and feature presenters from Adoption Rhode Island and the Department of Children, Youth, and Families. You will learn the steps of the adoption process, about the children waiting to be adopted and the rewards and challenges involved. There will be plenty of opportunity to ask questions. Attending a meeting does not obligate you to adopt or even take any further steps. Applications to start the adoption process are available at the meeting if you decide you are interested. Other routes to take to become involved in the lives of waiting children are discussed at the meetings.

What is a homestudy?

The homestudy will be explained fully at an Information Meeting. The simple answer—it is a mutual learning process. The process includes a series of group and individual meetings between prospective adoptive parents, family members, and a social worker, along with screening and reference requirements. The social worker will learn about you and your lifestyle in order to make the best match between you and the child or children eventually placed with you,.

What should I know about the children who are waiting for a family?

Like all children, these children and teenagers will make you laugh and make you cry; they will bring you joy and bring you challenges. They have experienced loss and trauma in their lives that the permanency of a forever family can help to heal. Some have had multiple foster care and group home placements. Our older children who have been waiting too long urgently need a family to help navigate the milestones of becoming a young adult. Some children are waiting with siblings, we try whenever possible to keep siblings together, honoring the importance of these relationships. 23


