Eligibility/Audience Served

Youth must meet at least one:

- Primary goal of APPLA
- Age 16 or older and discharging from RI Youth Development Center or Temporary Community Placement in the coming 12 weeks, or sooner
- Age 16 or older and on juvenile probation

- Individual & family counseling / trauma treatment
- Parent / caregiver education, support, and advocacy
- Psychoeducational, clinical, & support groups, including for Kinship families
- Supported community activities

Groups served:

- Children / youth who have experienced prolonged and complex trauma
- Youth in need of permanency.
- Children and/or families with complex needs
- Youth residing with kinship caregivers
- Caregivers in need of parent education

Eligibility:

Children ages 0 to 21 open to DCYF and/or at risk of opening to DCYF, and caregivers including birth parents, kinship caregivers, siblings, guardians, and pre-adoptive and adoptive parents.
