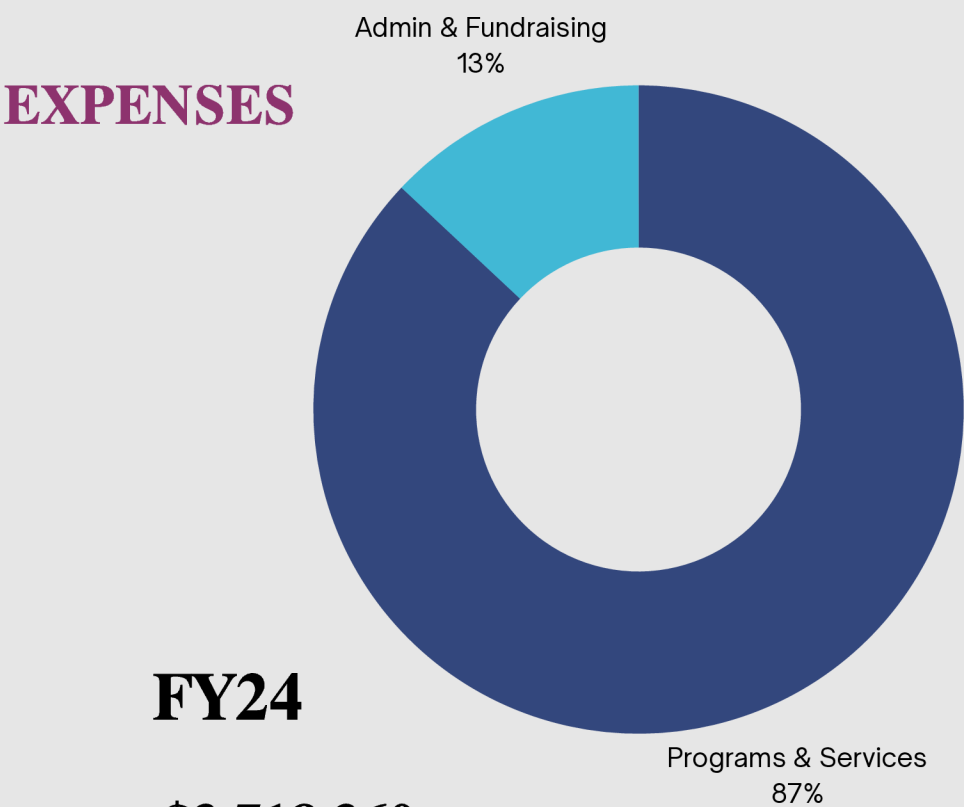
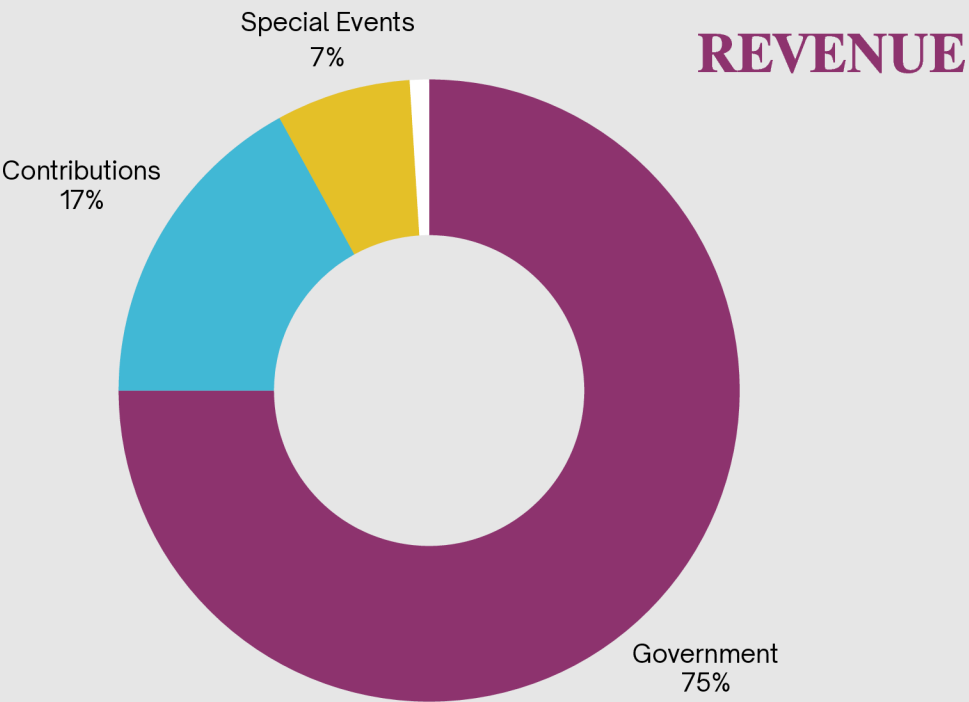

Achieved licensing as a Behavioral Health Organization and launched a new program for families funded by RI DCYF..

YOUTH & YOUNG ADULT SERVICES: Expanded our proven Teen Focus model with RI DCYF funding, and with non-public funds ARI grew and sustained services preventing homelessness for young adults. Success in ensuring that the dreams and potential of youth leaving foster care are realized and not derailed because they missed out on opportunities to succeed in school, find housing, or be connected to people to be by their side.
